Early Modern Britain was awash with pamphlets, ballads, woodcuts broadcasting bloodthirsty tales of traitorous wives, greedy mistresses, cunning female poisoning lacing the supper with deadly substances; of child killers and spiteful witches, stories of women wholly and unnaturally wicked. These were printed or sung, tacked the walls of alehouses, sold in the streets for pennies and read voraciously to thrill all. But why? Blessin Adams traded police work investigating today's crime in the Norfolk Constabulary for academia, tracing the lives and deaths of people in early modern England



Noongar poet Graeme Dixon is a member of the Stolen Generation; he was taken from his family at the age of three and spent several years at Sister Kate's before living in a Salvation Army boys' home

At the age of 16 he ended up in Fremantle Prison, where he spent most of the next nine years

Dixon's first poetry collection, Holocaust Island, was written in prison

At the age of 27, Dixon began tertiary studies and completed a course at Curtin University in politics, communications and Aboriginal studies


